The mentoring effort needs support, of both hearts and bank accounts. Stirring the hearts is the primary goal of the new mentoring film called "Hand to Hand." We've put a face on the huge task of providing mentors for the thousands of Los Angeles County foster youth who may have no other adult guide or role model.

Basketball great and mentor, Kareem Abdul Jabbar, introduces the film and closes it, because as he says, "mentoring allowed me to figuratively stand on the shoulders of giants." As a result, Kareem is lending his support to the programs depicted in the film, as well as many other mentoring ventures.

Mentoring foster children in Los Angeles is a pilot program developed through the collaborative efforts of ICAN, the Department of Children and Family Services, the Los Angeles Mentoring Model Coalition (LAMM), and the many mentoring organizations and professionals throughout the county. The film "Hand to Hand" is designed to be used by local communities and communities across the nation so that kids can "stand on the shoulders of giants."

## MESSAGE FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - DEANNE TILTON DURFEE

*"The Hearts of small children are delicate organs  
A cruel beginning in the world can twist them into curious shapes  
The heart of a hurt child  
May fester and swell until it has become a misery to carry within  
Easily hurt and chafed by the most ordinary things."*

- Carson McCullers



Picture yourself as a child who every day hears the cries of your baby sister. You hear the violent sounds of your mother and her boyfriend. You can't yell loud enough to be heard and no one knocks on the door. And then, one day, a woman in a uniform rescues you, not because anyone heard YOU, but because someone heard the gunshots.

Your mother and your baby sister are dead. No one talks to you about what happened. They say everything will be okay. You are placed in a foster home, a clean fresh place filled with happy faces...but they are strangers. No one understands the grief you are holding inside, how much you long for your mother or how guilty you feel about not protecting your baby sister.

Then, you are moved to another home, then another, then another. Now you are a teenager in your 15th foster home. There's no one who knew you when you were small, nobody who knew you last year. You have no consistent caring adult in your life, no one to brag to about a good grade, no one's voice is in your head to stop you from doing something that would disappoint them. No one talks to you about your mom or your baby sister.

### **So, why not steal the candy, try the drink, take the drug?**

You've lost your trust, now you're losing your conscience. You've become one of the statistics:

*National Institute of Justice:* As adolescents, or adults, abused children are more likely to commit violent crimes, drop out of school, or become unemployed or homeless.

*Centers for Disease Control:* Adult survivors of abuse are more likely to suffer heart disease, diabetes, fractures, obesity, and early death.

So, what could be different? What is different?

ICAN has worked for 30 years to bring agencies and individuals together to understand how and why children are abused, to be accountable for what we do in the name of child protection, and to do something about it.

- Our Child Death Review Team has been replicated in all California Counties, in every state in the US, and in 8 foreign countries
- L.A. County's implementation of the Safe Surrender Law has already saved the lives of 59 newborn babies
- Pool drownings are down
- Child and adolescent suicides are down
- Foster placements are half of what they were 10 years ago in LA County
- Child abuse homicides are down by one-half since 1991

However, our challenges and our work continue...

Even as we celebrate our successes, we must remember: Every four minutes, a child is born in Los Angeles County; every four minutes, a suspected child abuse report is made. Every day, four infants under the age of one week enter the child welfare system because of prenatal substance exposure. Each month, three children are killed by their parents or caretakers, and more than one child takes his or her own life. And, there are still over 20,000 children in foster care in LA County.

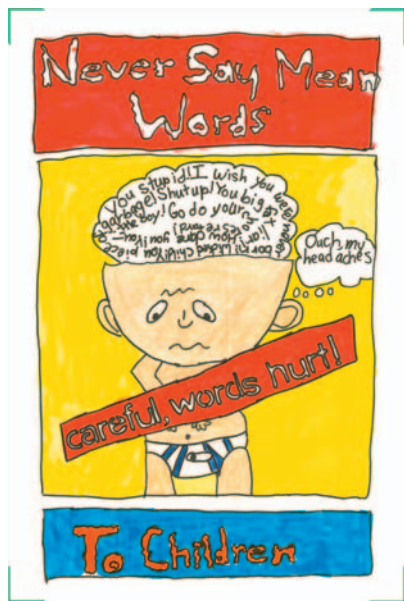
The most important resource we have is an informed and involved public. Friends, family, neighbors, the media, professionals, volunteers, and agencies working together. There is no one who is unable to do something to prevent the tragedy of child abuse and neglect, to mend the hearts of hurt children, and to make our future a kinder and safer place for us all.

### **What ICAN and ICAN Associates are doing now to help keep children and families safe and strong:**

- Our LA Mentoring Model (LAMM) is responding to the critical need for mentors to fill the hole in the hearts of foster children, to help them believe in themselves and know someone believes in them
- The Governor's Office of Emergency Services is providing ICAN with a grant to create protocols for multi-agency investigation and prevention of fatal and severe child abuse
- ICAN is launching a system to track what happens to the 1500 identified newborns affected by prenatal substance abuse
- Four years ago, the ICAN Grief and Mourning Task Force launched a major annual conference on children's grief, which draws experts from across the country
- Based on our increasing understanding of how Domestic Violence and Child Abuse are interrelated, we continue our annual NEXUS Conference for a thousand professionals and volunteers who deal with family violence
- We continue to promote information sharing and public awareness - the key to preventing newborn abandonment, and preventable child deaths from accidents, suicides, and homicides
- Our programs that guide and support pregnant and parenting teenagers, and to help families and child victims of abduction have realized excellent results
- We are preventing tragic child suicides, and reaching out to schools and the community

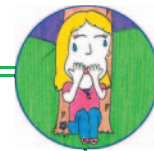

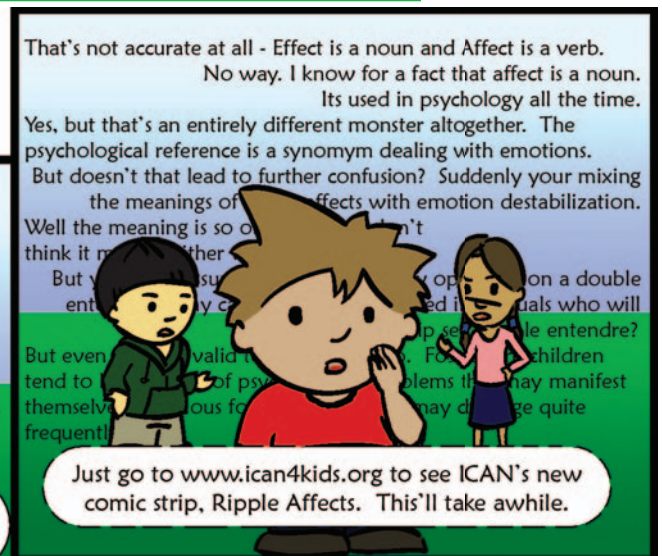
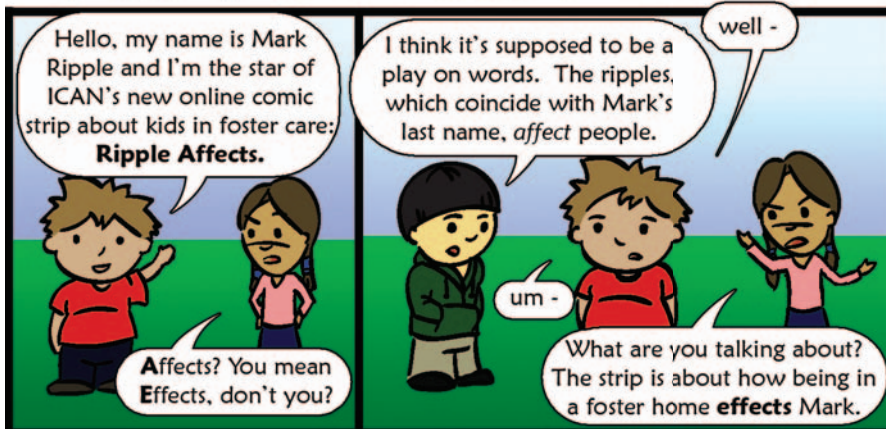

## MICHAEL DURFEE INVITED TO THE UNITED KINGDOM

**D**r. Michael Durfee, Chief Consultant of ICAN's National Center on Child Fatality Review (NCFR), presented his expertise in the UK in July. The Metropolitan Police Child Abuse Investigation Command invited him to the New Scotland Yard to speak to members of the London Children Safeguarding Board about child death response and review teams. Dr. Durfee also met with multiple UK Child Death Review Teams in Bristol and Coventry.

Dr. Durfee also presented at the World Health Organization (WHO) meeting, which addressed international efforts to decrease violence, including violence in the family. Felitti, M.D. on his groundbreaking study, *Adverse Childhood Experiences: The Lifelong Effects of Family Violence on Children*; Christina Crawford, author of the best seller, *Mommie Dearest*, on her personal perspectives on childhood abuse; and the Honorable Lois Haight, Presiding Judge of the Contra Costa County Juvenile Court and former Assistant U.S. Attorney General, with a compelling message about abused children and the responsibilities of the child protection system.
